The Maine Chapter of WTS is pleased to announce two annual scholarships in the amounts of \$2,500 and \$1,000 for an outstanding female high school senior who demonstrates an interest in science, technology, engineering and math and who is considering a career in the transportation industry. The recipient will be selected based on: academic performance in high school, participation in extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, and personal statement. The recipient may use the scholarship to defray the cost of her first year of study at the University of her choice. The scholarship will only be issued after the recipient provides proof of enrollment in an undergraduate degree program. Applicants must be Maine residents. Female minority students are especially encouraged to apply.

One way this is accomplished is by awarding the WTS – Maine High School Scholarship to young women pursuing undergraduate studies in science, technology, engineering, or math.

WTS – Maine Chapter works to make a difference in our communities by offering this scholarship to encourage highly motivated young women to explore exciting careers that will change the face of the transportation industry.

This year WTS – Maine Chapter is offering two High School Scholarships. The first is for \$2,500 and the second is for \$1,000. The minimum criteria for selection are:

- a. Applicant must be a female high school senior in the State of Maine or must have graduated from a high school in the State of Maine within the last year.
- b. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- c. Currently studying math, science, and technology.
- d. Considering a career in a transportation-related field.

Applications must be submitted through the local WTS – Maine Chapter as typed word documents. Scholarships are competitive, and selection is based on the applicant's specific transportation goals, academic record, leadership roles and extracurricular activities. If applicable, describe your specific transportation related goals. Personal statement should not exceed 500 words or two pages. *Please attach as a typed word document to application form.*
